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Without **meaningful and immediate investments** in biomedical research, the 28,000 people living with ME/CFS in Massachusetts will struggle to find answers to critical questions about the disease's cause, diagnosis, and treatment. Events like today's, bolstered by the advocacy and outreach performed by many in this room, have helped to bring this devastating condition out of the shadows and into the spotlight. **We will keep our constituents with ME/CFS in mind as we push for expanded biomedical research opportunities and funding in the U.S. House and Senate.** ”
